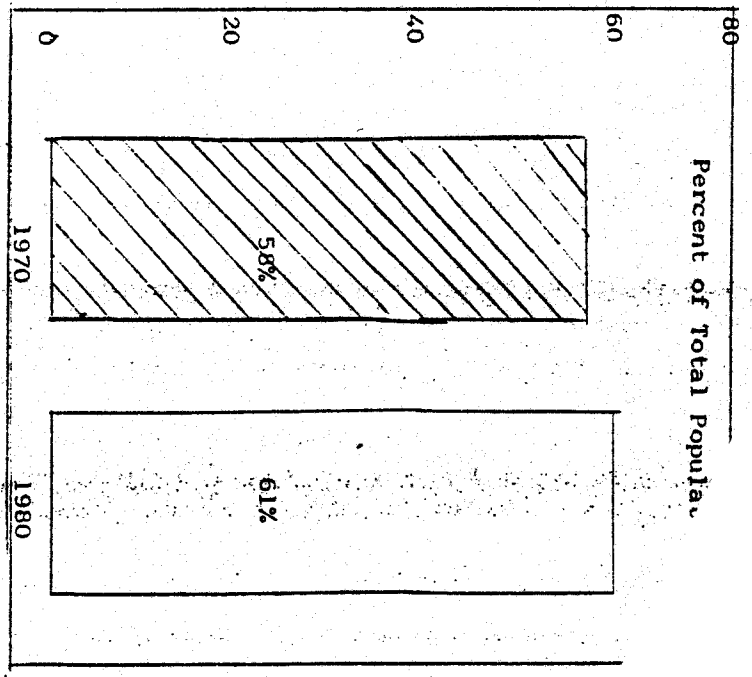
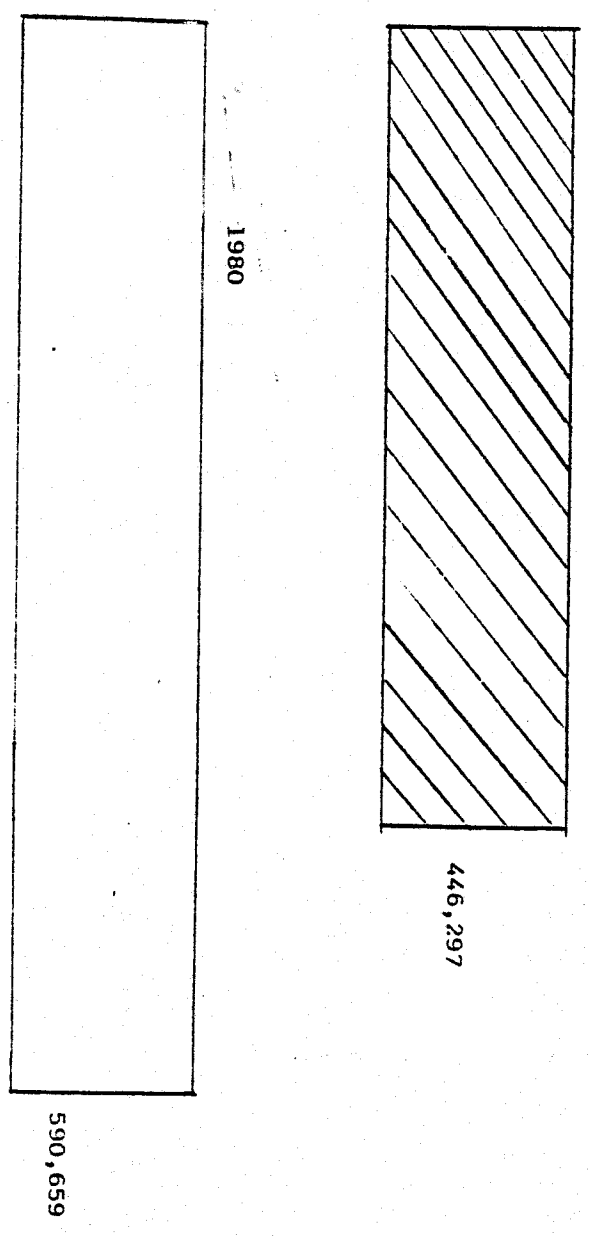
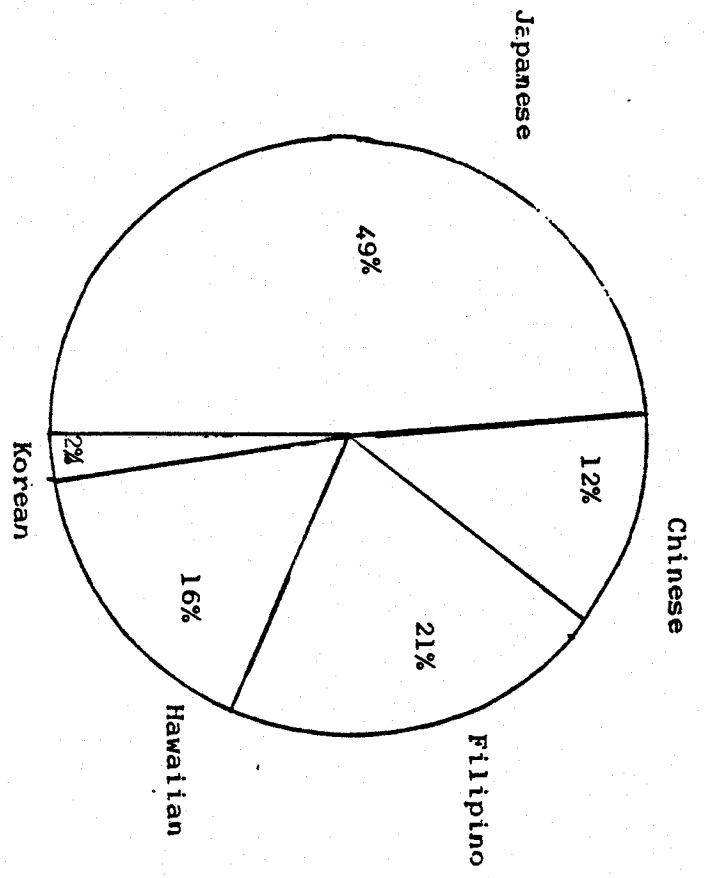
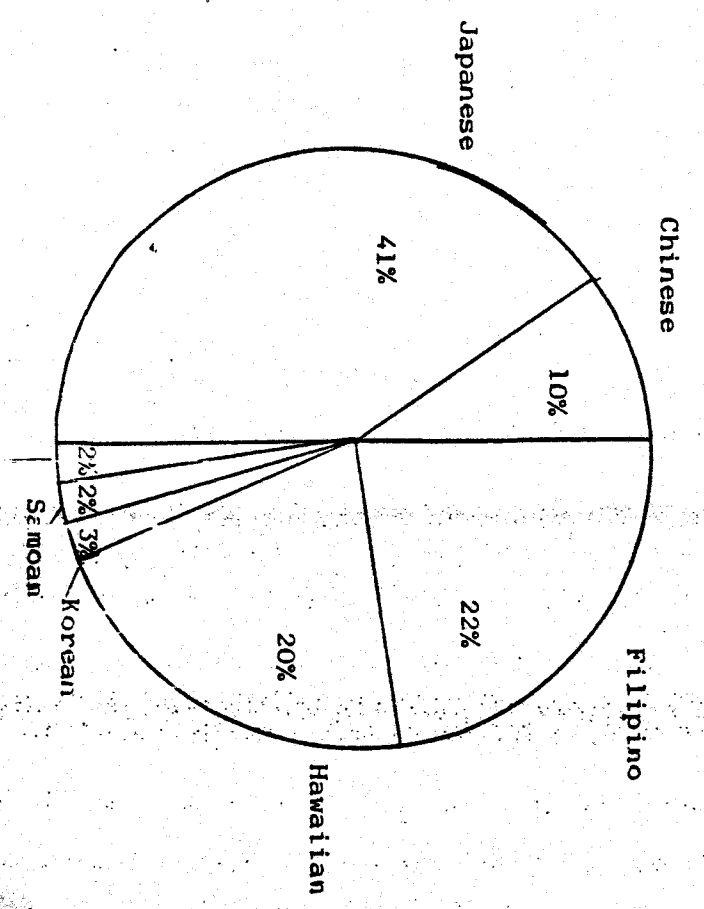


Figure 2.—Composition of the Asian and Pacific Islander Population in Hawaii: 1970 and 1980



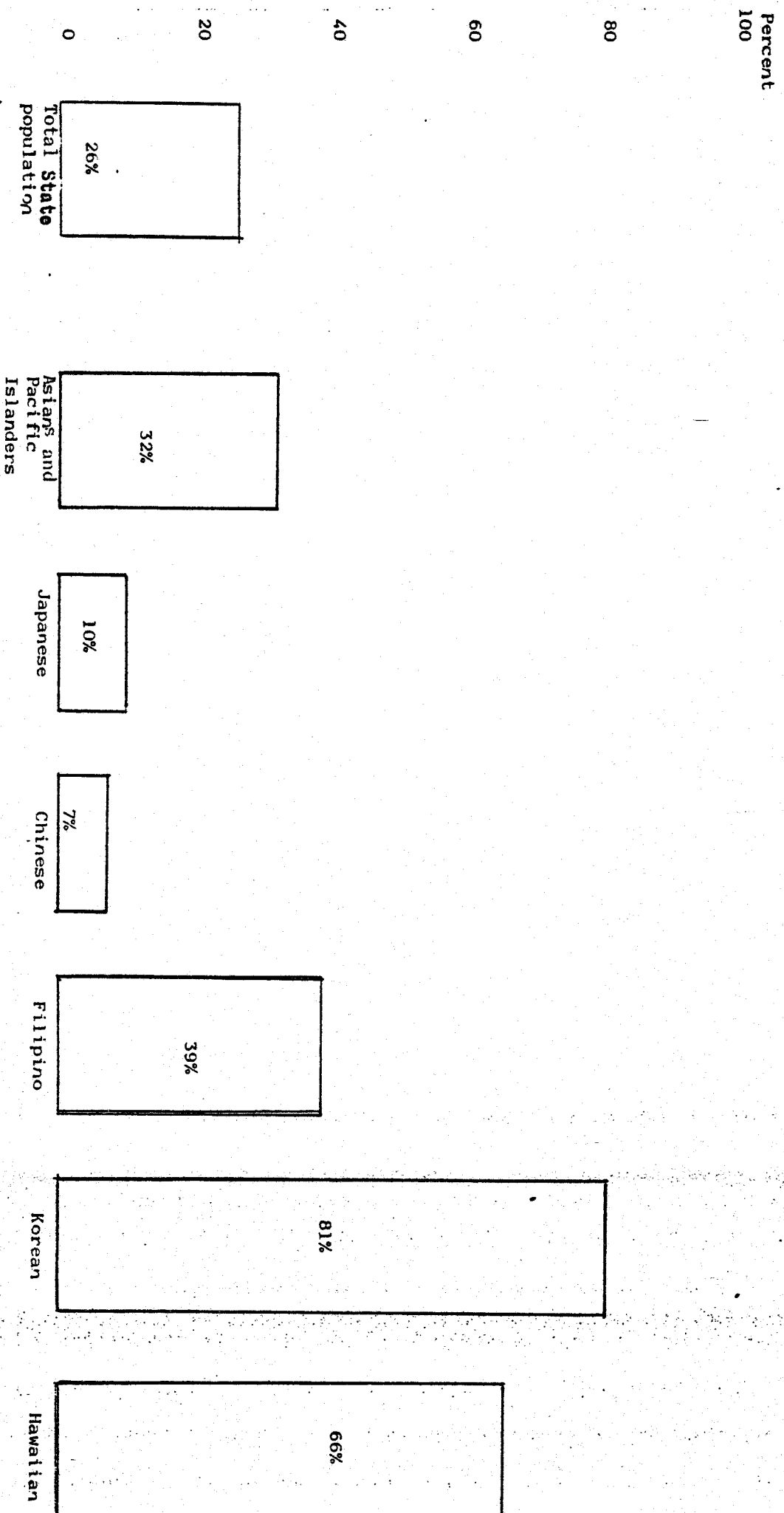



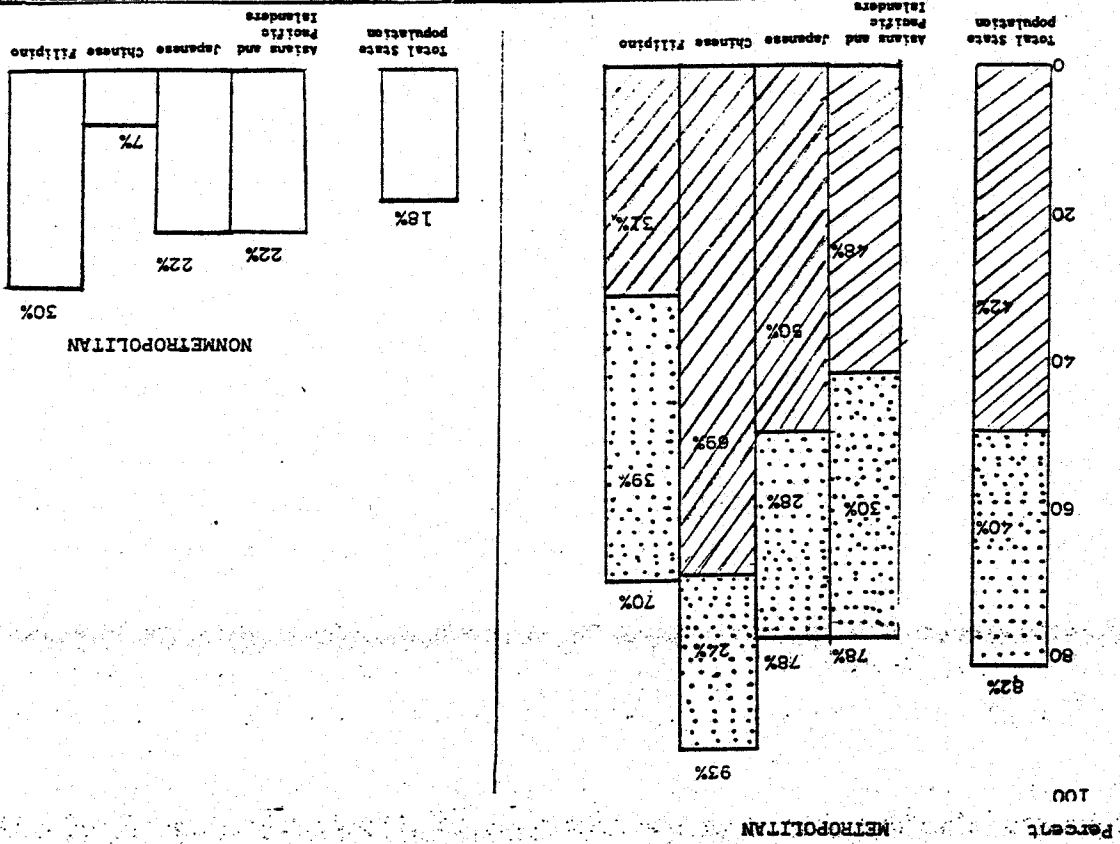
Figure 3.--Percent Change Between 1970 and 1980 in the Asian and Pacific Islander Population in Hawaii

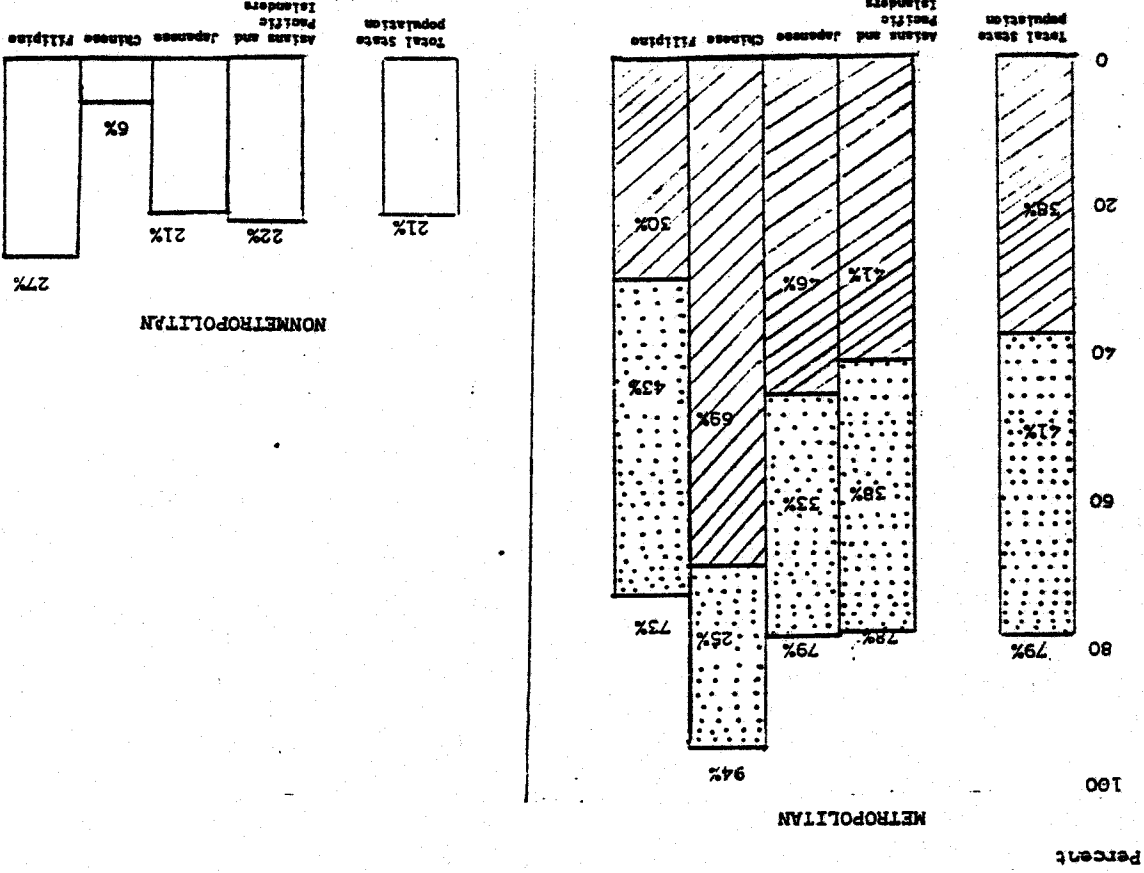
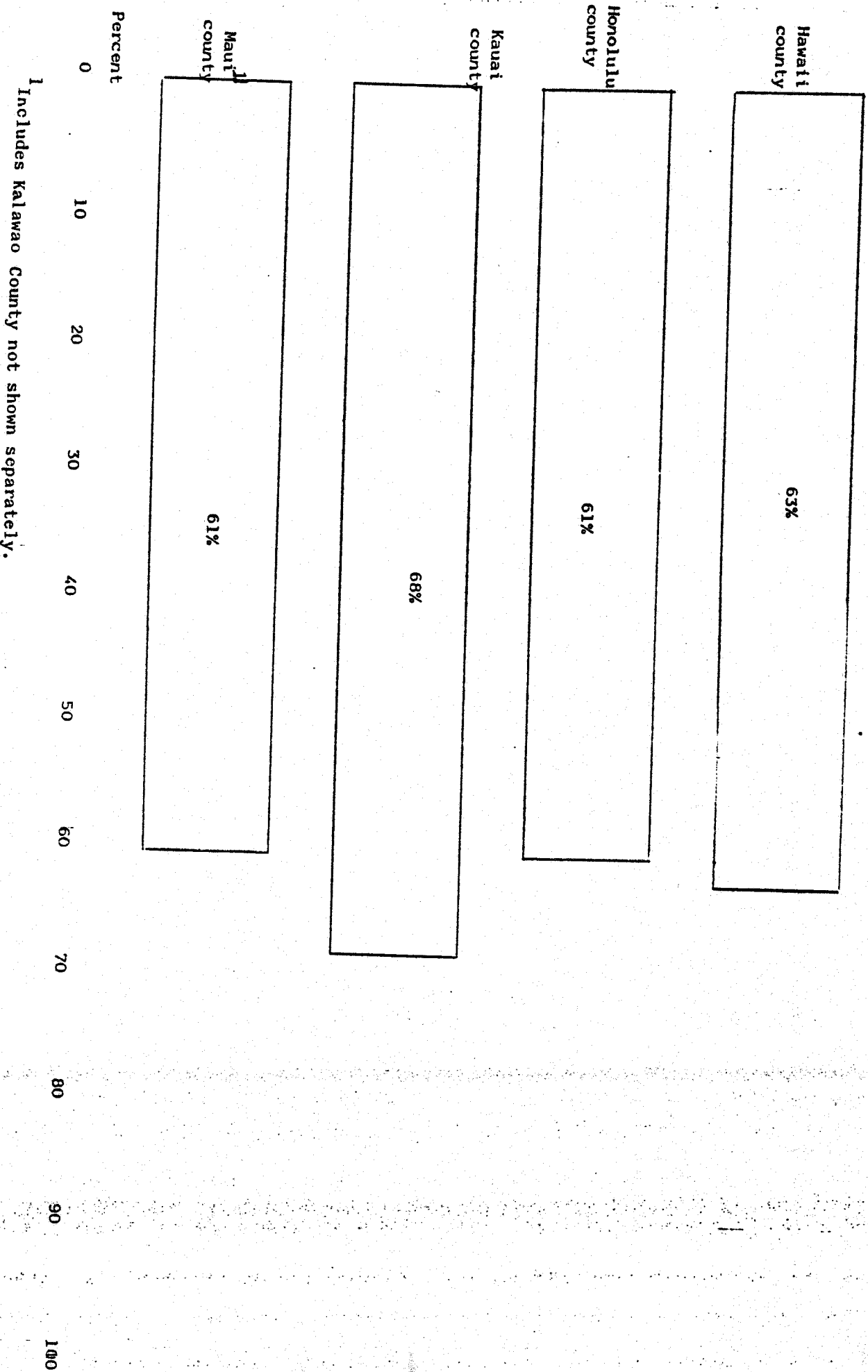
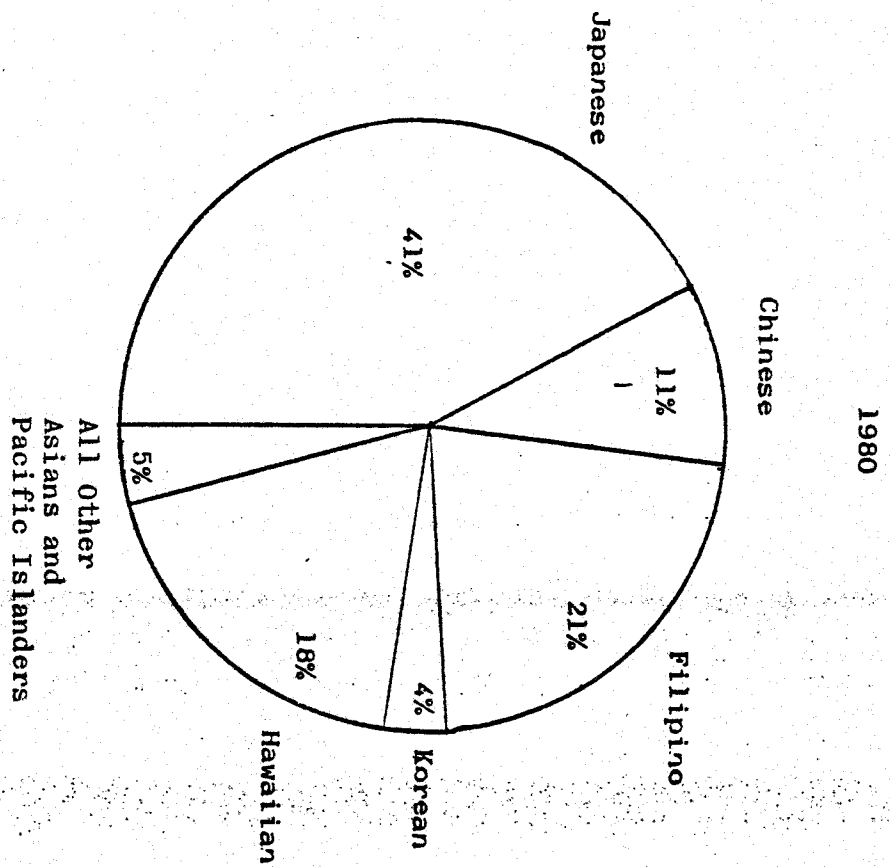
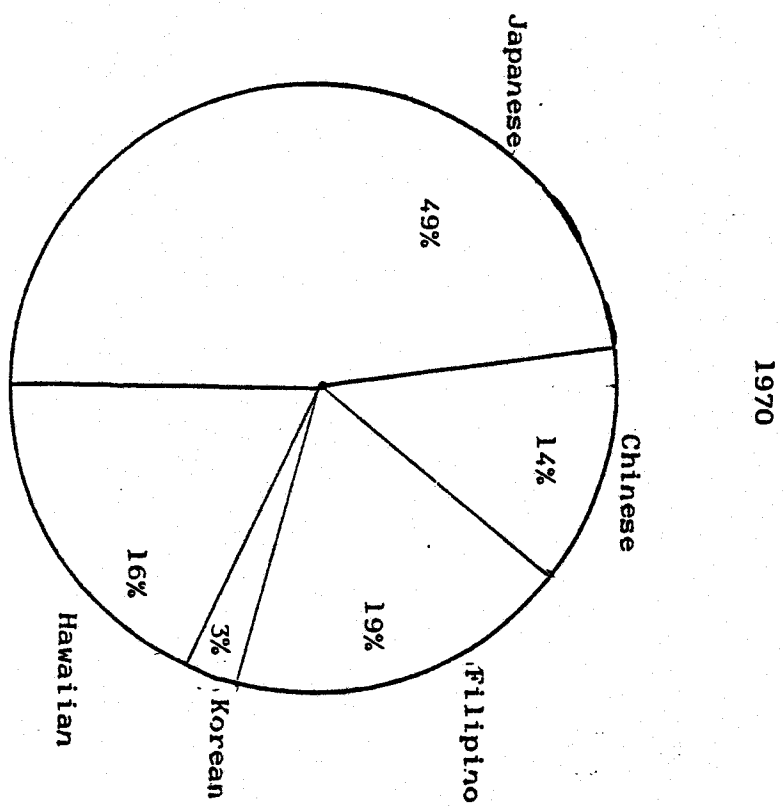


Figure 5.--Asian and Pacific Islander Population as a Percent of the Total Population in Hawaii by County: 1980
