INTRODUCTION AND ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

This report contains the results of the Current Labor Force Survey (CLFS), First Quarter, 1999, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI).

The report begins with a summary of results of the survey. The detail results of the survey are shown in tables that make up the body of the report. Appendix I discusses the purpose and methodology of the Survey and Appendix II describes variables used in the survey.

There are two sets of tables in this report. The first set of tables are numbered Tables G.1.0 through G.21.1 while the second set of tables are numbered Tables H.1.0 through H.45.1. To further distinguish the two sets, the tables in the first set are referred to as with "GQs" (or with "group quarters") population while tables in the second set are referred to as with "no GQs" (or with "no Group Quarters") population. An important difference between the two sets is that while the statistics in the first set covers the entire population of Saipan, the tables in the second set covers only the households population, that is, the portion of the total population who lived in households, and exclude the portion of the population who live in group quarters; hence, the second set is a subset of the first. The reasons for the two sets of tables is based on the methodology of the Survey which is explained in Appendix I. The survey uses two survey instruments to collect data: (1) a more detailed questionnaire to collect data from households selected to participate in the survey and (2) a shorter form to collect fewer types of data from all group quarters. So that tables with "GQs" include estimates for the entire population but with only a limited number of variables while tables with "no GQs" contain more variables but only a subset of the entire population of Saipan. Therefore, use the first set of tables, with "GQs", when interested in statistics for the entire Saipan and use the second set of tables, "no GQs" when interested in more detailed statistics on the portion of population who lived in households only.

SURVEY RESULTS SUMMARY

The following is a summary of the results of the CNMI Current Labor force Survey, First Quarter, 1999 (also referred to as round 6).

GENERAL POPULATION

Population. The estimated population on Saipan Island in the Commonwealth of the Mariana Islands in the First Quarter, 1999, was 71,790. About 66,000 persons lived in Census Bureau-defined “urban” areas – places of 2,500 or more – and about 5,000 lived in rural areas. Since Saipan was the only island included in Round 6 of the Current Labor Force Survey, no counts are provided for Rota or Tinian. (Table G.1.0)

By Census-defined Districts within Saipan, District 6 had the highest estimated population (17,606) followed by District 10 (17,215), District 11 (16,321), District 8 (6,323). Although District 2, 3, 4, and 5 had relatively fewer populations as individual Districts, they are small contiguous areas making them densely populated Districts.

The Census Districts are based on 1980 established boundaries where, Districts 1, 2, 3, 4 are Chalan Kanoa, District 5 is Susupe, District 6 is San Antonio-Afetna-Kobleville, District 7 is San Jose-Chalan Laulau, District 8 is Tanapag-Capitol Hill-As Teo-Kagman, District 9 is San Roque-As Matus-Marpi, and District 10 is Kagman-Papago-San Vicente-Dandan, and District 11 is Garapan-China Town-Navy Hill-Puerto Rico-Sadog Tasi.

Median age. The estimated median age of Saipan’s population in the First Quarter, 1999, was 28.9 years – half the population was older than 28.9 years, and half was younger.

The Asians are concentrated in the higher age groups compared to Chamorros, Carolonians, and Micronesians. The main reason being that most Asians are in ages between 20 and 54 who came into the CNMI for employment purposes. (Table G.8.0)

Sex ratio. The population had more than 38,800 females and about 33,000 males, a surplus of more than 5,000 females. The sex ratio, the number of males for each 100 females, was 84.6. The median age for females 27.8 years, somewhat younger the median for the whole population, so the median age for males was slightly higher.

Ethnicity. The largest ethnic group on Saipan in the First Quarter, 1999, was Asians with over 40,000 persons (56 percent). Among Asians, Filipinos were largest, at over 21,000, followed by Chinese with 13,000. The largest islander group was Chamorros (13,000, 18 percent of the total population of Saipan.) More than 11,000 males were Filipino (about 1/3rd of all the males) and 6,600 were Chamorros. For Females, Chinese/Taiwanese and Filipinos had about equal numbers, about 10,000 each, followed by Chamorros (6,700). The Asians outnumbered Islanders between ages 20 to 54 (Table G.2.0).

By geography, Chamorros were concentrated in Districts 10, 11, 8, and 6. Carolinians were in Districts 10, 11, 7 and 6. Asians were concentrated in Districts 11, 6, 10, 8, and 7. (Table G.2.0)

Birthplace. Birthplace is collected only for persons 15 years and over in the Current Labor Force Surveys. In First Quarter, 1999, about 12,000 persons had been born in the CNMI, about 21 percent of the adult population; hence, more than 3/4th of the adults were born outside the CNMI (Table G.3.0). About 36,000 persons were born in Asia – 66 percent of the adult population – and 3,700 (7 percent) were born in the Freely Associated States (FAS--Palau, Federated States of Micronesia, and the Marshall Islands).

Citizenship. More than 30,000 (43 percent) of the estimated population on Saipan in the First Quarter, 1999, were United States citizens (Table G.4.0). Of the 41,600 non-US citizens, about 36,000 were temporary residents (about half of all of Saipan's population). Of the US Citizens, 13,000 (43%) were Chamorros, followed by Filipinos 3,600 (12 percent), Carolinian 2,300 (7 percent). Of the non-US citizens, over 17,000 (42 percent) were Filipino, 13,000 (31 percent) were Chinese, 3,600 (9 percent) were Micronesians. (Table G.19.0)

The US citizen population is relatively younger than the Non-US population. The main reason being that most Non-US citizens are in ages between 20 and 54 who came into the CNMI for employment while US citizens include children and persons below 20 years of age, bringing down the median age for US citizens. (Table G.10.0)

Year of entry. Year of entry was collected for persons 15 years and over. As noted above, 21 percent of the adults were born in the CNMI. Of the 43,000 adults born outside CNMI, almost half came to the CNMI between 1997 and 1999. Another 16,000 came in earlier in the decade. As would be expected, 39,000 of the 43,000 (90 percent) were non-U.S. citizens. (Table G.10.0)

Reason for migration. About 36,000 of the 43,000 (83 percent) of the non-CNMI adults immigrants came to the CNMI for "employment". Smaller numbers came for "business", as family members of an employed person, or as students.

LABOR FORCE POPULATION

Labor Force participation. An estimated 46,000 persons, about 84 percent of the persons 16 years and over were in the labor force in the First Quarter, 1999. Over 43,000 were employed, while only 2,500 (5.5) were unemployed. For females, the percentage in the labor force was about (82 percent) which is lower than males labor force participation of 88 percent. (Table G.5.0)

Labor Force Participation by Citizenship. Labor force participation rate for non-US citizens (91 percent) was higher than US citizens rate (68.4 percent). Labor force participation rate for Non-US citizens is also higher than US citizens across all age groups (Table G.11.1 & 2). This is mainly because Non-US citizens in the CNMI came for employment.

Labor Force Participation by Ethnicity. Chinese had the highest labor force participation rate (98 percent), followed by Filipinos (92 percent) and other Asians (78 percent). Micronesians (68

percent), Chamorros (68 percent), and Carolinians (56 percent) had comparatively lower labor force participation rates. (Table G.20.0)

Labor Force Participation by Birthplace. Persons born in Asian countries had higher labor force participation rate compared to those born in the CNMI and FAS. (Table G.16.0)

Employment. An estimated 43,600 persons were employed in Saipan in the First Quarter, 1999. Majority of employed persons were within ages 20 and 54, with age-group 25 to 29 being the largest. (Table G.11.0)

Employment by Citizenship. About 80 percent of all employed persons were non-US citizens while 20 percent were US citizens or a ratio of four to one. (Table G.11.1&2)

Employment by Ethnicity. About 38 percent of all persons employed were Filipinos, 29 percent were Chinese, 10 percent were Chamorros, less than 2 percent were Carolinians, about 5 percent were Micronesians. (Table G.20.0)

Employment by Birthplace. Three fourths of the 43,600 employed persons were born in Asian countries, 14 percent were born in the CNMI, and about 6 percent were born in the Freely Associated States. (Table G.16.0)

Employment by Industry. In terms of number of workers, the largest industry was “manufacturing” with 14,700 workers (34 percent) followed by “Services” industry with 11,800 (27 percent), “Retail trade” with 5,900 (14 percent), “Construction” with 3,200 (7 percent), “Transportation, communication & other utility” with 2,800 (6 percent), “Public Administration” with 2,400 (5 percent). The Survey showed total female outnumbered total males employed in Saipan in the First Quarter, 1999. Over forty-eight (48) percent of the 23,400 employed females were in “manufacturing”, 25 percent were in “Services”, 14 percent were in “Retail Trade”. About 30 percent of all employed males were in the “Services” industry, 16 percent were in “Manufacturing”, 15 percent were in “Construction” and 13 percent were in “Retail Trade”. (Table G.6.1)

In all major industries, except “Public Administration”, Non-US Citizens constituted the majority of total workers. Also, in all major industries, except “Public Administration”, persons born in Asia constituted the majority of total workers (Table G.17.0-3).

Filipinos outnumbered all other ethnic groups across all industries except in “Manufacturing” and “Public administration”. Chinese constituted 75 percent of all persons in “Manufacturing” while Chamorros were the largest (57 percent) ethnic group in “Public administration”. (Table G.21.0)

Employment by Occupation. The largest number of workers (37 percent) were in “operators, fabricators, and laborers”, followed by “managerial and professional specialties” (19 percent), “Service” occupations (17 percent), “Technical, sales, and administrative support” (14 percent), “precision production, craft and repair”, then “Farming, forestry, and fishing” (2 percent). (Table G.6.1)

Non-US Citizens constituted the majority of total workers in all major occupational groups. Also, in all major occupational groups, persons born in Asia constituted the majority of total workers (Table G.17.0-3).

Filipinos outnumbered all other ethnic groups across all occupation groups except in “Operators, fabricator, and laborers” where Chinese constituted about 70 percent. (Table G.21.0)

Employment by Class of worker. About 86 percent of all employed persons were “private for wage and salary workers”, 11 percent were “government workers”, and about 3 percent were “self-employed”. More than half (51 percent) of the 9,000 US citizens employed in Saipan were working for “private for wage and salary”, 44 percent were in “government”, and 5 percent were self-employed. Ninety-five percent of 34,600 employed Non-US citizens were in “private for wage and salary” and only less 5 percent were in government or self employed. (Table G.17.1-3)

Unemployment. An estimated 2,500 persons were unemployed in Saipan in the First Quarter, 1999, or an unemployment rate of 5.5 percent. Unemployment is relatively higher in lower and higher age groups while relatively lower in middle age groups. Female unemployment rate of 5.1 percent is lower than the male unemployment rate of 6 percent. (Table G.11.0-2)

Unemployment by Citizenship. Unemployment rate for non-US citizens (3.2 percent) is much lower than U.S citizens (13.4 percent). Unemployed US citizens tend to be in younger age groups compared to unemployed Non-US citizens. Unemployed US citizens are more likely to be young persons entering the labor force for the first time while unemployed non-US citizens are likely to be displaced or other migrant workers in relatively older age groups. (Table G.11.1-2)

Unemployment by Ethnicity. Filipinos (1.2 percent) and Chinese (1.1 percent) have lower unemployment rates than Micronesians (18 percent), Chamorros (12.6 percent), and Carolinians (21.5 percent). Of the estimated 2,500 unemployed, 692 were Chamorros, 467 were micronesians, 211 were Filipinos, and 226 were Carolinians. It is notable that Other Asians unemployment for this quarter was much higher than Filipinos and Chinese at about 9 percent or about 330 persons. (Table G.20.0-2)

Unemployment by Birthplace. Unemployment rate of born in the CNMI (16.1 percent), Palau (15.5), FSM (24.7 percent), are higher than persons born in Asia (1.9 percent)--born in Philippines (1.2 percent), China (1 percent)--and born in Guam/US (7.4 percent). Of the estimated 2,500 unemployed persons, over 1,100 were born in the CNMI, over 600 were born in Asia, 300 were born in FSM, and about 200 were born in Palau (Table G.16.0).

INCOME

Household income. The median household income for the quarter before the survey (Fourth Quarter, 1998) was \$19,600 when annualized. To obtain the annualized income, the recorded quarterly income was multiplied by 4. The median income is midpoint for all households' incomes – half of the CNMI households earned more than the median, and half earned less. The mean household income during the quarter for the survey was \$34,800, much more than the

median household income. The mean income was higher because means are the averages obtained by aggregating all income, and then dividing by the total number of households. Hence, the mean income is more affected by outliers, particularly those few households with very large incomes because of land rentals or large businesses.

Family income. Family incomes tend to be higher than household incomes because families must have related members. Hence, a single person could be a household, but not a family. The annualized median family income for the Fourth Quarter, 1998, was \$22,400, much lower than the mean family income of \$40,700. (Table H.9.0)

Individual income. The more than 14,800 adult males with income in the CNMI in the Fourth Quarter, 1998 had an annualized median income of about \$9,000 – about \$4.50 per hour. The over 13,000 adult females with income had a median income of about \$7,900, over a \$1,000 less than the males. (Table H.9.0)

Per capita income. Per capita income is obtained by aggregating all income for a group, and dividing by all the members (including children and aged) of the group. The annualized per capita income for the CNMI in the Fourth Quarter, 1998, was \$9,800. This per capita income, however, is only for persons in households and does not include persons in group quarters.

Type of income. As would be expected, most income in the CNMI is wage and salary income, over 87 percent of all households reported wage and salary incomes with mean earnings of about \$26,000, Fourth Quarter, 1998. Self-employed mean income was much higher than for wage and salary workers. About 2,500 households had “other” income, with an average mean earnings of \$21,000.

CONCLUSION: FIRST QUARTER, 1999 vs FOURTH QUARTER, 1998

This conclusion compares the results of the First Quarter, 1999, Survey with the results of the Fourth Quarter, 1998, Survey.

Saipan’s First Quarter, 1999, estimated population (71,800) was higher than the Fourth Quarter, 1998 (68,900). Labor force participation rate in the First Quarter (84.7 percent) was slightly higher than the Fourth Quarter’s (83.9 percent) and unemployment rate in the First Quarter (5.5 percent) was lower than the Fourth Quarter’s (6.2 percent). The total number of persons employed in the First Quarter (43,600) was higher than the Fourth Quarter’s (40,600). Industries that showed higher number of workers in the First from the Fourth Quarter include “Manufacturing”, “Services”, and “Construction”. Median and mean household and family incomes reported in the First Quarter were higher than incomes reported in the Fourth Quarter.

The increase in the estimated population and number of persons employed in Saipan was due to increase in the number of workers counted in Group Quarters, in addition to increase in the households population. In the First quarter there were over 17,000 persons counted in Group Quarters, but only 15,000 in the Fourth Quarter.

Appendix I

Background, Purpose, and Methodology of the CNMI Current Labor Force Survey

Background and Purpose of the Current Labor Force Survey

The Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) and the U.S. Department of the Interior's Office of Insular Affairs (OIA) established the Current Labor Force Survey (CLFS) to obtain reliable statistical data on current population dynamics through sample surveys. Each survey collects information on the size, composition, and changing patterns of the general population and the labor force.

The size and composition of the labor force and other detailed employment statistics measure the economic activity and economic development in a country or region. The distribution of labor force by various industrial sectors, occupational composition, class of worker, and other characteristics provide profiles of the economy. These variables show the principal sectors of production and distribution in the economy as well as the level of use of the available labor force.

The statistics on population and labor force were collected in the 1973, 1980, 1990, and 1995 censuses in the CNMI. Although censuses provide good data on the labor force, they are conducted too infrequently, and are expensive and time consuming. Also, the results usually take a while to publish because the operations are so big. Labor market conditions change considerably between censuses, decreasing the usefulness of the census statistics. Censuses provide important benchmark statistics, but do not give full coverage to the labor market conditions during the intervening years.

Since 1940, the U.S. Government has been conducting the Current Population Survey in the United States, a monthly sample survey on the labor force. The Survey measures employment, and unemployment among scientifically selected households through joint efforts of the Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Bureau of the Census.

If the CNMI were a state, it would be included in this and other U.S. surveys. Because it is not a state, it is not included in any survey. Only through the funding of the Office of Insular Affairs was the CNMI able to implement this survey program.

The CLFS was implemented to monitor the changing conditions of the labor market in the CNMI on a regular basis. The survey makes available current and reliable statistics under the legal provision provided under the 1990 CNMI Statistical Act, enacted in 1991.

Objectives of the Current Households Survey

The primary objective of the CNMI Current Labor Force Survey is to produce quarterly statistics on the CNMI labor force relating to employment and unemployment, industry composition, occupational composition, and income, as well as other characteristics of the work force. Another objective of the Survey is to show changes and trends in the characteristics of the general population in the CNMI.

It is also the objective of the CLFS to use supplements to obtain other statistical data that are required for development planning and other administrative purposes (unavailable from other sources). For example, the 1999 fourth quarter CLFS will collect information on health in the CNMI, in addition to labor force data.

All quarterly surveys collect data on population and labor force; however, some quarterly surveys collect additional data on specific topics. The surveys began in 1996: two quarterly surveys in 1996, two surveys were done in 1998 and three surveys will be done in 1999. One survey was done in 1997, but the fieldwork was incomplete.

Survey Area Coverage

Except for the 1999 fourth quarter survey that covered Saipan, Tinian and Rota, all surveys conducted since 1996 covered Saipan only. This is primarily because of funding limitation. The other reason is because Saipan's population is about 90 percent of the CNMI's total population, hence the pattern of population and labor force changes in Saipan pretty much represent the entire CNMI.

The Survey Methodology

A census is potentially the most accurate way to obtain population, labor force participation, and other statistics, but it is very expensive and time consuming. Hence, CNMI has a census only once every five years: US Bureau of Census funds those in years ending in zero and the CNMI local government funds those ending in 5.

During the intervening time, the most economical way to obtain population and labor statistics is through some form of estimating process.

One way to estimate the population is to benchmark the population at a point in time, say 1995. Then each year or quarter after the benchmark, add the number of births, less out the number of deaths, and add net migration. The CNMI has statistics on births and deaths, but no data on net migration, making it impossible to use this method.

Another way to estimate the population is to calculate the growth rate between two census periods, such as 1990 and 1995, and then use this growth rate to estimate the population for a desired point in time. This methodology is used in the CLFS.

A reliable sample survey is the most common approach used to estimate the labor force and other subpopulations--the proportions of the various subgroups in the survey become the basis for estimating the various subpopulations.

In the CLFS, instead of simply taking the growth rate of the total population and using that growth rate to estimate the quarterly population, the total population in the CNMI is divided into two segments: (1) population in households and (2) population in group quarters. In each quarterly survey, an estimate of the households population is based on the growth rate of this

segment between 1990 and 1995. A count of all persons in group quarters is also conducted and then the two population segments are added together to estimate the total population. Detailed estimates are presented below.

This procedure allows for more accurate estimated statistics on population, labor force and subpopulations. The reason for measuring these two segments separately is based on the historical behavior of these two populations. Based on prior censuses, the CNMI population has these two distinct population segments as shown below.

While the households population increased in all census years, the group quarters population increased dramatically from 1980 to 1990, but declined from 1990 to 1995. The main reason for this fluctuation in the group quarters' population is the movement of migrant workers into and out of the CNMI. Economic growth in the CNMI has made it necessary to bring in workers from outside. The movements in these two population segments reflect the labor demands of companies doing businesses in the CNMI. Because the local labor force is small to begin with and does not always possess the necessary skills currently demanded, companies hire and bring in workers from outside. The most economical way for a company to house a large number of workers brought in is to house them in group quarters. This is particularly the case in garment manufacturing, construction and hotel industries. Hence, the population in group quarters may go up or down drastically depending on the labor demands of these industries. Other industries bring in workers from outside, but tend to house their workers in household units, rather than in group quarters. This partly explains why the households population has been increasing quite rapidly since 1980. The household segment of the population has been increasing because of the increasing number of local households being formed, as partly evidenced by homestead project expansions, and because of increased number of non-family households which include unrelated persons living together and working for small companies. For more detail on group quarters, see Appendix II.

Data Collection

The Household Sample

The Survey used the 1995 Census listing of household as the sampling frame. In each of the quarterly surveys, about 10 percent of the total listing is randomly selected to participate in the Survey. The actual number of households completed and used in estimating the statistics varies from quarter to quarter, depending on the success of the survey enumerators in completing survey forms for each of the selected household units.

In each survey, about ten percent of total 1995 household listing are randomly picked. Then, using the 1995 census maps and address registers, enumerators located the appropriate household units and conducted interviews and complete the survey questionnaires. All survey enumerators were trained using the same training procedures that have been in place since 1996. Manuals on training and questionnaires are available at the Central Statistics Division, Department of Commerce, CNMI. The survey results were coded and keyed in the Central Statistics Division and processed with assistance and guidance from the U.S Census Bureau's International Programs Center.

Group Quarter Counts

At the time of each Survey counts and some characteristics of the group quarters population are obtained. Survey enumerators work with owners/representatives of companies that have employees living in group quarters. The companies provide the survey enumerators with data on each person living in group quarters. To minimize the amount of time, the type of data collected from each person through this approach is limited to 6 items: Age, Sex, Citizenship, Birthplace, Date of Entry, and Occupation. Although the survey gets a reasonably accurate count of the group quarters population, it does not capture as much detailed data from each person, as data collected from persons in households.

Population Estimates in the Surveys

SAIPAN POPULATION ESTIMATES

The population in Saipan at the time of the survey was estimated as follows:

First, the Saipan's total population was divided into two parts: (1) the total number of persons living in household units, referred to as "household population" and (2) the total number of persons living in group quarters, referred to as "group quarters population". Definitions for households and group quarters here were the same as those used in CNMI censuses.

The households population at the time of each survey was estimated using the households population levels in 1990 and 1995 and the monthly population growth rate between these two CNMI censuses.

The group quarters population for each survey was a complete count of all persons living in all group quarters during the survey period. From a current listing of group quarters in Saipan, enumerators worked with each group quarter company representative to obtain a listing of all occupants in each quarter and their citizenship, place of birth, year of entry, sex, birthday, age, industry and occupation.

Appendix II

Variables and Definitions

AGE

The data on age were obtained from responses to questionnaire item "M" under the field "Age". Age of the person was in complete years as of survey reference date. The age responses in "M" normally represented a person's age. However, when the age response was unacceptable or unavailable, the age was derived from an acceptable year-of-birth response in the field "Birthdate" under "M". The variable age was asked of all persons who participated in the Survey. Age was asked of persons in the households and group quarters.

CITIZENSHIP

The data on citizenship were obtained from responses to "Citizenship" field under item "M". This variable was asked of all persons in the Survey, both in households and in group quarters. Each person was classified into one of the six possible categories: (1) born in CNMI, (2) born in the United States or another U.S. Territory or Commonwealth, (3) born elsewhere of U.S. parent or parents, (4) U.S. citizen by naturalization, (5) non-US citizen permanent resident, or (6) non-US citizen temporary resident.

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

The data on educational attainment were obtained from responses to questionnaire items 6 and 7. These questions were asked only of persons 15 years old and older. Persons were classified according to the highest grade of school completed or the highest degree received. For persons currently enrolled in school, the question included instructions to report the level of the previous grade attended or the highest degree received. Educational attainment was asked only of persons in households.

EMPLOYMENT STATUS

The data on employment status were derived from responses to questionnaire items 8 to 11 which were asked of persons 15 years and over in households. The series of questions on employment status was designed to identify in this sequence: (a) persons who worked at a job or business or farm at any time during the reference week (b) persons who did not do such work during the reference week, but who had jobs or business from which they were temporarily absent (excluding layoff); (c) persons on layoff; and (d) persons who did not work during the reference week, but who were looking for work to earn money.

Employed - All persons 16 years old and over who were either (a) "at work" - those who did any work at all during the reference week as paid employees or in their own business or profession, or on their own farm, or who worked 15 or more hours as unpaid workers on a family farm or in a family business; or (b) were "with a job but not at work"- those who did not do such work during the reference week, but who had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent due to illness, industrial dispute, vacation, or other personal reasons.

The Survey excluded from the "employed" persons without jobs or businesses whose only activity consisted of work around the house or unpaid volunteer work for religious, charitable, or similar organizations; persons without jobs or businesses who did subsistence activity only.

Unemployed - All persons 16 years old and over who (a) were neither "at work" nor "with a job but not at work" during the reference week, or who did subsistence activity only; (b) were looking for work to earn money during the last 4 weeks; and (c) were available to accept a job.

The Survey also considered as unemployed all persons 16 years old and over who did not work at a job or business during the reference week and were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off.

Labor Force - All persons employed and unemployed combined.

Not in Labor Force - All persons 16 years old and over who were not classified as members of the labor force. This category consisted mainly of persons doing subsistence activity only, students, housewives, retired workers, institutionalized persons, and persons doing only incidental unpaid family work (less than 15 hours during the reference week).

Subsistence Activity - A person was engaged in subsistence activities if he or she mainly produced goods for his or her own or family's use and needs, such as growing/gathering food, fishing for home use, raising livestock, making handicrafts for home use, and other productive activities not primarily for commercial purposes. Subsistence activity categories shown with the "Employed" and the "Not in labor force" categories of the employment status concept, related to activities engaged in during the survey reference week. The Survey did not classify persons who did subsistence activity only during the reference week as "employed," unless they were "with a job but not at work" (see definition of "employed").

Worker - This term appears in connection with several subjects, for example, class of worker, weeks worked during the survey period. Its meaning varies and, therefore, should be determined in each case by referring to the definition of the subject in which it appears.

Actual Hours Worked Last Week - All persons who reported working at a job or business or farm during the reference week were asked to report in questionnaire item 9 the number of hours that they worked, excluding any time at subsistence activity. The statistics on hours worked for "employed, at work" persons pertained to the number of hours actually worked at all jobs, and did not necessarily reflect the number of hours typically or usually worked or the scheduled number of hours.

The questionnaire items and employment status concepts for the Survey were essentially the same as those used in the 1990 and 1995 censuses.

ETHNIC ORIGIN OR RACE

The data on ethnic origin or race obtained from the responses to questionnaire item "M", field "Ethnicity". The question was based on self-identification and was open-ended (respondents were required to provide the answer). Ethnic origin or race referred to a person's origin or descent, "roots," heritage, or place where the person or the person's parents or ancestors were born. Persons reported their ethnic group regardless of the number of generations removed from their place of origin.

Ethnic origin or race is different from other population characteristics that are sometimes regarded as indicators of ethnicity, namely country of birth and language spoken at home. A large number of persons reported their ethnic origin or race by specifying a single ethnic group, but some reported two, three, or more ethnic groups. The Survey coded responses by a procedure that allowed for identification of the first two responses reported.

In published tabulations, the Survey designated multiple groups in general open-ended categories such as "Chamorro and other group(s)," rather than in specific multiple ethnic groups such as "Chamorro-Carolinian". We included a person who reported "Chamorro-Carolinian" ethnicity, for example, in the "Chamorro and other group(s)".

GROUP QUARTERS

The Survey classified all persons not living in households as living in group quarters. Two general categories of persons lived in group quarters: (1) institutionalized persons and (2) other persons in group quarters (also referred to as "noninstitutional group quarters").

Institutionalized Persons - Included persons under formally authorized, supervised care or custody in institutions at the time of enumeration.

Other Persons in Group Quarters (also referred to as "noninstitutional group quarters") - Included all persons who lived in group quarters other than institutions. When 10 or more unrelated persons lived in the unit, they were classified as "other persons in group quarters"; otherwise, we classified these living quarters as housing units. Most of these types of group quarters that exist in the CNMI were for living arrangement for companies that provide housing for their employees. These were mainly for garment manufacturing companies, construction companies, and hotels.

HOUSEHOLD

A household included all the persons who occupied a housing unit. A housing unit was a house, an apartment, a group of rooms, or a single room that was occupied (or if vacant, was intended for occupancy) as separate living quarter. Separate living quarters were those in which the occupants lived and ate separately from any other persons in the building and which had direct access from the outside of the building or through a common hall. The occupants might be a single family, one person living alone, two or more families living together, or any other group of related or unrelated persons who shared living arrangements. The count of households or householders always equaled the count of occupied Housing units.

RELATIONSHIP TO HOUSEHOLDER

Householder - The data on relationship to Householder were obtained from answers to questionnaire item "M" under the field "Relationship", which was asked of all persons in housing units. Relationship was not asked of persons in group quarters. The Survey designated one person in each household as the householder. In most cases, the householder was the person, or one of the persons, in whose name the home was owned, being bought, or rented and who was listed as person 1 on the survey questionnaire. If no such person existed in the household, respondents or enumerators selected any adult household member 15 years old and over as the householder.

Two types of householders were distinguished: a family householder and a non family householder. A family householder was a householder living with one or more persons related to him or her by birth, marriage, or adoption. The householder and all persons in the household related to him or her were family members. A nonfamily householder was a householder living alone or with one or more persons--but with less than 10--not related to one another.

FAMILY

A family consisted of a householder and one or more other persons living in the same household who were related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption. All persons in a household who were related to the householder were regarded as members of his or her family. A household could contain only one family for purpose of survey tabulation. Not all households contained families since a household might comprise a group of unrelated persons or one person living alone.

INCOME

The data on income were derived from answers to questionnaire items 17-18. Information on money income received in the Fourth Quarter, 1998, was asked of persons 15 years old and

over. "Total income" was the sum of the amounts reported separately for wage or salary income; net nonfarm and farm self-employment income, interest, dividend, or net rental royalty income; Social Security or retirement income, public assistance or welfare income, and all other income.

Income of Households - Included the income of the householder and all other persons 15 years old and over in the household, whether related to the householder or not. Because many households consisted of only one person, average household income was usually less than average family income.

Income of Families and Persons - In compiling statistics on family income, the incomes of all members 15 years old and over in each family were summed and treated as a single amount.

Median Income - The median divides the income distribution into two equal parts, one part having incomes above the median and the other having incomes below the median. For households and families, the Survey based median income on the distribution of the total number of units including those with no income. Median income for persons was based on persons with income. Median income values for all households, families, and persons were computed on the basis of more detailed income intervals than shown in most tabulations.

Mean Income - Mean income is the amount obtained by dividing the total income of a particular statistical universe by the number of units in that universe. Thus, the Survey obtained mean household income by dividing total household income by the total number of households. For the various types of income the means were based on households having those types of income. "Per capita income" - the mean income computed for every man, woman, and child in a particular group - was derived by dividing the total income of a particular group by the total population of that group.

Care should be exercised in using and interpreting mean income values for small subgroups of the population. The mean is especially susceptible to the effects of misreporting and processing errors because it is influenced strongly by extreme values in the distribution. The median, which is not affected by extreme values, is a better measure than the mean when the population base is small. The mean, nevertheless, is shown in some data products for most small subgroups because, when weighted according to the number of cases, we can add the means to obtain summary measures for areas and groups other than those shown in survey tabulations.

INDUSTRY, OCCUPATION, AND CLASS OF WORKER

The data on industry, occupation, and class of worker were obtained from answers to questionnaire items 13 to 15. Information on industry related to the kind of business conducted

by a person's employing organization; occupation described the kind of work the person did on the job.

For employed persons, the data referred to the person's job during the reference week. For those who worked at two or more jobs, the data referred to the job at which the person worked the greatest number of hours. The survey derived industry and occupation statistics from the detailed classification systems developed for the 1995 census as described below.

Respondents provided the data for the tabulations by reporting descriptions of their industry and occupation. Clerks in the Central Statistics Division's processing office used these descriptions for coding. The clerical staff converted the written questionnaire descriptions to codes by comparing these descriptions to entries in the Alphabetical Index of Industries and Occupations.

INDUSTRY

The industry classification system developed for the 1995 census, and use in the Survey, consisted of 235 categories for employed persons, classified into 13 major industry groups. Since 1940, the industrial classification was based on the Standard Industrial Classification Manual (SIC). The 1995 census classification was developed from the 1987 SIC published by the Office of Management and Budget, Executive Office of the President.

The SIC was designed primarily to classify establishments by the type of industrial activity in which they were engaged. However, survey data collected from households differed in detail and nature from those obtained from establishments surveys. Therefore, the survey classification systems, while defined in SIC terms, could not reflect the full detail in all categories.

OCCUPATION

The occupational classification system developed for the 1995 census and used in the survey consisted of 500 specific occupational categories for employed persons arranged into 6 summary and 13 major occupational groups. This classification was developed to be consistent with the Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) Manual: 1980, published by the Office of Federal Statistical Policy and Standards, U.S. Department of Commerce. Tabulations with occupation as the primary characteristic present several levels of occupational detail.

Some occupation groups were related closely to certain industries. Operators of transportation equipment, farm operators and workers, and private household workers accounted for major portions of their respective industries of transportation, agriculture, and private households. However, the industry categories included persons in other occupations. For example, persons employed in the transportation industry included mechanics, freight handlers, and

payroll clerks; and persons employed in the private household industry included occupations such as gardener and domestic helper.

CLASS OF WORKER

The data on class of worker were derived from answers to questionnaire item 15. The information on class of worker referred to the same job as a respondent's industry and occupation and categorized persons according to the type of ownership of the employing organization. The class of worker categories were defined as follows:

Private Wage and Salary Workers - Included persons who worked for wages, salary, commission, tips pay-in-kind, or piece rates for a private for profit employer or a private not-for-profit, tax exempt or charitable organization. Self-employed persons whose business was incorporated were included with private wage and salary workers because they were paid employees of their own companies.

Governments Workers - Included persons who were employees of any local, territorial, or Federal government unit, regardless of the activity of the particular agency.

Self-Employed Workers - Included persons who worked for profit or fees in their own unincorporated business, profession, or trade, or who operated a farm.

Unpaid Family Workers - Included persons who worked 15 hours or more without pay in a business or on a farm operated by a relative.

MARITAL STATUS

The data on marital status were derived from answers to questionnaire item 2, which was asked of all persons 15 years old and older in households. The marital status classification referred to marital status at the time of enumeration. Data on marital status were tabulated only for persons 15 years old and over.

All persons were asked whether they were "now married," "widowed," "divorced," "separated," or "never married." Couples who lived together (unmarried persons, persons in common-law marriages) reported the marital status they considered the most appropriate.

REFERENCE WEEK

The Survey related data on current labor force status relate to the reference week; that is, the calendar week preceding the date on which the respondents were interviewed by enumerators. This week was not the same for all respondent since the enumeration was not completed in one week. The occurrence of holidays during the enumeration period could affect the data

on actual hours worked during the reference week, but probably had no effect on overall measurement of employment status.

SCHOOL ENROLLMENT AND TYPE OF SCHOOL

The data on school enrollment were derived from answers to questionnaire item 6. Persons were classified as enrolled in school if they reported attending a regular public or private school or college at any time during the survey period.

SEX

The data on sex were derived from answers to questionnaire item “M” field “Sex”, which was asked of all persons. For most cases in which sex was not reported, the Survey used the appropriate entry from the person's given name and household relationship. Otherwise, sex was imputed according to the relationship to the householder and the age and marital status of the person.

WORK STATUS

The data on work status were obtained from answers to questionnaire item 16.

Work Status in the Survey - Persons 16 years old and over who worked 1 or more weeks according to the criteria described below were classified as “worked” during the survey; all other persons 16 years old and over were classified as “did not work” in the survey period.

Weeks Worked - The survey derived data on weeks worked in First Quarter, 1999 from answers to questionnaire item 16b. Question 16b (Weeks worked during the survey period) was asked of persons who indicated in Question 16a that they worked in during the survey period.

The data pertain to the number of weeks during in which a person did any work for pay or profit (including paid vacation and paid sick leave, but excluding subsistence activity) or worked without pay on a family farm or in a family business.

Usual Hours Worked per Week Worked - The survey derived data on usual hours worked per week worked in First Quarter, 1999 from responses to questionnaire item 16c. This question was asked of persons 16 years and over who indicated that they worked in First Quarter, 1999. These question was not asked of persons in group quarters.

The data pertain to the number of hours a person usually worked during the weeks worked in First Quarter, 1999. The respondent was to report the number of hours worked per week in the majority of the weeks he or she worked during the quarter. The statistics on usual hours

worked per week worked were not necessarily related to the data on actual hours worked during the census reference week.

Persons 16 years old and over who reported that they usually worked 35 or more hours each week during the weeks they worked were classified as "Usually worked full time"; persons who reported that they usually worked 1 to 34 hours were classified as "Usually worked part time."

YEAR OF ENTRY

The Survey derived data on year of entry from answers to questionnaire item 4, which was asked of all persons 15 years and older.
