

Pilot Survey of FSM High School Graduates

Preliminary Data

Survey conducted late 2001 to mid 2002

NOTES:

- This pilot survey began in late 2001 with the goal to study the counts, characteristics and trends of FSM high school graduates over the years. Two schools, Xavier High School (XHS) and Outer Islands High School (OIHS), were selected for the pilot survey.
- Xavier High School (XHS) is a private Jesuit school located on Weno, Chuuk. It opened in 1952 as an all-male school. It became co-ed in 1975, and has had increasing number of female graduates. From 1952 to 2001(49 years), the school produced 1,086 graduates.
- Outer Islands High School (OIHS), is a Yap State Government public high school located on Falalop Ulithi(an outer island of Yap). From 1963 to 2001(38 years), it produced 1,435 graduates.
- These preliminary results cover 554 graduates. Of that total, 152 were XHS graduates and 402 were OIHS graduates.

SUMMARY OF MAJOR CHARACTERISTICS

SEX, ETHNICITY AND GRADUATION YEARS

These data were collected directly from the two schools for all graduates. The schools graduated a combined total of 2,521 students from 1956 to 2001. Of that total, 1,915 (76%) were males and 606 (24%) females.

PILOT SURVEY OF FSM HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES

The following is a brief summary of the methodology used in the pilot survey and text analysis of major characteristics:

METHODOLOGY: First, the participating schools were contacted and informed about the pilot survey and requested to provide existing data on their graduates (alumni). Then, the school administrators agreed that the graduates (alumni) could be approached for interview. The survey questionnaire was one page and used in the interview process in a number of ways: person-to-person interview, telephone interview, email, and online Internet survey.

SEX AND AGE

This pilot survey began in late 2001 and ended in mid 2002. It captured 554 graduates (152 graduates of Xavier High School and 402 graduates of Outer Islands High School), and, of these, 392 males and 162 females. The median age suggests that Xavier High School graduates are likely to complete college and get better employment opportunities at a much younger age than their counterparts.

ETHNICITY

Of the total 554 graduates, 546 were FSM citizens, 6 Palauans, and 2 Marshallese.

RESIDENCE

At the time of the survey, 467 graduates resided in FSM, 40 in Hawaii, 25 in US, 15 in Guam, and 7 in other places.

REASONS FOR MIGRATION

The primary reason for migrating was to pursue further schooling.

EXPECTED DATE OF RETURN

Many graduates were undecided about when to return home. Of those residing outside of FSM, 22 graduates planned to return home in 2 to 4 years.

LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME

The language primarily spoken at home for those residing in FSM is the native language. For the graduates residing outside FSM, English was their primary language spoken at home.

TYPE OF SCHOOL ATTENDED

Majority of the graduates were not enrolled in school at the time of the survey. Of the 554 graduates, 57 were attending public college and 16 were in private school.

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Of the 554 graduates, 177 completed high school only, 24 earned elementary teaching certificates, 146 did not complete college, 127 earned associate degrees, 61 Bachelor's, 15 Master's and 4 Doctorate degrees.

FIRST SCHOOL TO ATTEND

The top three choices of school were College of Micronesia-FSM (formerly CCM) followed by Palau Community College (formerly PCC) and US college/university.

PERIOD OF FIRST SCHOOL ENROLLMENT

The number of graduates enrolled in college increased over the years and peaked during period 1990 to 1994.

EMPLOYER

Of the 323 employed graduates, 201 were Government (including Education services) employees, 38 worked for Retail Trade, and 29 for Restaurants, Bars, and Hotels.

OCCUPATION

Of the 323 employed graduates, 87 were teachers while 49 were government officials (includes legislators and high-ranking officials).

CLASS OF WORK

Majority of the employed graduates (189) work for the government while 111 graduates work in the private sector.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

This item was asked of the Xavier High School graduates only. Of the 152, 29 graduates participated in some type of community service (clean-up, tutoring, mentoring, etc.) once a week, while 25 volunteered once a month.

TOTAL INCOME

Majority of the employed graduates (218) were earning annual incomes of less than \$10,000. Of that 218, 117 graduates were making less than \$5,000 a year.

The median income shows that XHS graduates (\$12,874) were earning far higher income than OIHS graduates (\$5,410).

Noteworthy Points:

- The data show that Xavier High School graduates were completing college at a much younger age than the Outer Islands High School graduates.
- Xavier High School graduates were also likely to earn a much higher income at a younger age than their counterparts.
